Leukocytoclastic vasculitis (LCCV)	IgA $\kappa$ or IgG $\lambda$	Purpuric macules and papules on lower extremities (similar to LCCV from other causes)	Leukocytoclasia and fibrinoid necrosis of vessel wall	Usually when associated with multiple myeloma or cryoglobulinemia (type II)
Erythema elevatum diutinum	IgA	Red-purple to red-brown papules, plaques, or nodules	Leukocytoclasia and fibrinoid necrosis of vessel wall	Usually when associated with multiple myeloma or cryoglobulinemia (type II)
Subcorneal pustular dermatosis	IgA	Annular or polycyclic lesions with superficial pustules	Leukocytoclasia and fibrinoid necrosis of vessel wall	Usually when associated with multiple myeloma or cryoglobulinemia (type II)
